Sophie brings a wealth of experience and vision to the role, and we look forward to working with her in the years ahead. We again express our gratitude to the former Artistic Director, William Hennessy AM, for his many years of service to MCO and to music.

### **Melbourne Orchestral Season**

MCO's Melbourne season offered 11 performances across 6 orchestral projects. All had at least a Thursday and Sunday performance at Melbourne Recital Centre, with two concerts having a third performance at Alexander Theatre, Monash University. Three programs were also streamed online on Australian Digital Concert Hall.

The season began in March with two performances of *Classical Vienna* at Melbourne Recital Centre, featuring guest co-directors Zoe Black and Stefan Cassomenos. Stefan premiered his own MCO commissioned work, the *Three Minute Concerto*.

Zoe Black returned to guest direct *Mozart/Salieri*, while other guest directors included Sophie Rowell (*Bach's World* and *Mozart & The Violin*), Alexandra Osborne (*Rhapsodic Bohemians*), and Sulki Yu (*Vivaldi's Four Seasons*).

Leading and emerging artists collaborated with the orchestra as soloists, including: on violin, Jos Jonker, Jennen Ngaiu-Keng, and Karla Hanna; on piano, Hoang Pham; and on flute, Prue Davis.

MCO principals Natalia Harvey guest directed and appeared as a soloist in Vivaldi's Four Seasons, while Emma Sullivan appeared as a soloist to premiere Louise Trewartha's MCO commissioned work, *Anderson's Kew*.

MCO also performed Caerwen Martin's Stars come out in a midnight sky, while Daylesford Music by Calvin Bowman had its long-awaited premiere. Daylesford Music was commissioned by MCO and donors from Daylesford at our 2019 festival, A Feast of Music. Daylesford Music was due to premiere in 2020 but was delayed by the pandemic. The concept was inspired by Nicholas Buc's Yackandandah Music, which was similarly commissioned by MCO and donors from Yackandandah, a town close to Beechworth, where MCO performs annually.

## **Chamber Season & Digital Season**

We extended our partnership with Australian Digital Concert Hall (ADCH) to present chamber performances at Athenaeum Studio 2. The 2022 chamber season was performed for a live studio audience and streamed on the ADCH platform. MCO is an ADCH ensemble-in-residence and supports the initiative in its growth toward the vision of a sustainable digital platform for musicians. In 2022, three orchestral season performances and all chamber season performances were digitally streamed live.

Guest artists that collaborated as part of MCO's quartets and quintets included: on violin, Alexandra Osborne, Kristian Winther, Elizabeth Sellars, and Tair Khisambeev; on piano, Stefan Cassomenos; on clarinet, Philip Arkinstall; and on flute, Laila Engle.

MCO Principal Double Bassist Emma Sullivan also guest curated a program.

The orchestra commissioned and premiered two new chamber works: a clarinet quintet, *Principia Clarinettica*, by Joe Chindamo and a piano quartet by Linda Kouvaras.

#### **Education**

## Encounter the Orchestra!

Primary school students in Grades 3 to 6 in outer Melbourne and regional areas were provided with a live encounter with Melbourne Chamber Orchestra. The structured, narrated events include performances, interaction, explanations, demonstrations and an opportunity for students to sing accompanied by the orchestra. The purpose of the program is to provide a strong stimulus for students' achievement in their music study.

In 2022, there were four sessions across Narre Warren (327 students) and Portland (228). The program was associated with MCO's *Vivaldi's Four Seasons* tour.

This program is funded through the Victorian Department of Education's Strategic Partnership Program.

## Masterclasses

Chamber touring provides the opportunity for musicians to coach a small group of school-aged instrumental students in regional and remote communities that would otherwise not have such diverse musical development opportunities. This year, guest artist Elizabeth Sellars led a masterclass in Mildura, while MCO principal Natalia Harvey led a masterclass in Bendigo.

## **Public Programs**

Another way MCO engages with our audiences while touring is through pre-concert talks for orchestral programs and small-group community workshops for chamber programs.

In 2022, pre-concert talks were held for Vivaldi's Four Seasons at Moonee Ponds and Werribee. MCO continued its community workshop in Mallacoota, with MCO musicians performing work by local composers alongside local musicians. The Mallacoota workshop was possible through the significant contribution of local musician Padma Newsome.

## **A Feast of Music**

Melbourne Chamber Orchestra's festival in Daylesford, A Feast of Music, brings five chamber music events into Victoria's leading regional tourism destination. The three-day festival included a musical dinner at the Lake House, an orchestral concert = and three chamber music concerts.

Guest musicians in 2022 included Ensemble Liaison and Stefan Cassomenos.

Supporters of the 2022 Festival included Australian Government (through the RISE Fund), Creative Victoria, Biggin Scott Daylesford, eCasa, Kawai, Lake House, and Red Hare Estate Vineyard.
