- 7. Use of video recording devices and mobile communication devices by audience members is prohibited during performances.
- 8. MCO, or its authorised third parties, reserves the right to record, broadcast, stream or simulcast any performance. You consent to being photographed or filmed by MCO or its authorised third parties and MCO may publish, license and use any images or video of you without compensation.
